TSA Anesthesiologists

TSA anesthesiologists are highly skilled and dedicated physicians who are medical doctors trained in anesthesiology. Their goal is to provide the highest possible level of anesthesia care and perioperative pain management. Your anesthesiologist has completed four years of college, four years of medical school and then underwent another four years of specialized anesthesia training. While caring for you, they are making decisions that ensure your safety and comfort such as ensuring that all your vital bodily functions are maintained as those functions are frequently affected by the surgical procedure being performed.

TSA Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists

TSA Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist/CRNA's are Advanced Practice Nurses who are members of your anesthesia care team and who are specifically trained in anesthesia. CRNA's have completed four years of nursing school and obtained specialized advanced training after gaining experience in Intensive Care nursing. They, along with your anesthesiologists, are the most stringent advocates of your safety in the operating room and are there to provide excellent anesthesia care.

How do the anesthesia professionals care for me on my day of surgery?

The members of TSA practice in the Anesthesia Care Model. The Anesthesia Care Team consists of anesthesiologists supervising CRNA's in the provision of anesthesia care.
